When people find an injured bird of prey along the Wasatch Front, they go to DaLyn Ericksen, a wildlife specialist at the Ogden Nature Center. Erickson is the Jane Goodall for avians. She's on call 24 hours a day, seven days a week to rescue anything from a sparrow to a Bald Eagle hoping to rehabilitate them so they can be put back into the wild.
